Some Albuquerque politicians are proposing a plan to create tent encampments for homeless people on public property. Renee Grout will oppose this proposal on the City Council because it's a bad idea that will make our city's homeless problem even worse.

Tent Cities Make Problems Worse

The Albuquerque Journal reports that other cities that tried homeless encampments on public property resulted in “a dismal failure.” In Austin, “*it increased the number of folks sleeping outside*” and “*saw increased violence in the homeless population (by a sizeable 10%).*” (*Albuquerque Journal, 8/16/21*)
